




# GBV Laws and Policies in Sudan

**Standard procedures** for government support to prevent and respond to GBV have been adopted



Priority 5 of the Transitional Government emphasizes protection of for women's rights

**Women's participation** in government is required to reach 40%



Positive public discourse about women, including perceptions and portrayals in **media**, is encouraged



Framework Agreement to Combat Sexual Violence Related to Conflict in Sudan has been adopted

A National Plan to Implement S.C. Res. 1325 on Women Peace and Security adopted



**Sexual violence** on a wide scale was committed in the context of armed conflict, and official immunity for armed forces and state employees was used as an excuse for the perpetrators to avoid prosecution.



A **draft law** on Violence Against Women has been developed and submitted

**Hotlines** have been established to assist women in reporting violence and seeking psycho-social support and medical advice



Laws have recently been changed to allow women and girls more **freedom of movement**, and to protect them from **FGM**.
